2. 2017 Preparations**Local Host Updates**

- **Venue** - The venue is confirmed and locked down.
- **Accessibility** – Working on shuttle bus accessibility while the venue is fully accessible now.
- **Website** - The website is pending updates with the latest information which is expected to be completed by this Friday. The website will be mapped to the domain <http://2017.aprifg.asia> according to the instructions from the secretariat.

- **Internet** - Local Host enquired about the bandwidth required and secretariat quoted from the RFP to Local Host for 2017 that “the minimum uplink of 20Mbps is required to support the simultaneous Internet access of all participants”. Wilson added that a separate Internet provision for live streaming is not compulsory but enough bandwidth is important. Soong added that a dedicated event network apart from the normal university wifi is preferred.
- **Sponsor** – Local Host enquired about the regional support available. Secretariat responded that APNIC and Internet Society APAC bureau has both supported for the Fellowship Program and the secretariat has also reached out to Google regional office on Asia Pacific Legislative Roundtable (APLR) specifically but yet to be finalized. Secretariat encouraged local host to also reach out to their local offices which Google happened to sponsor separately in Taipei for both offices.
- **Registration** - Secretariat also projected the registration form ready to be launched with the website on screen.

Action Items:

Program Committee Updates

- Soong updated that the Program Committee has completed scoring and yet to finalize the result. Below are the key progress highlights:
 - 18 sets of completed scores from Program Committee members
 - 29 session slots available excluding Opening, Closing Plenary, and NRI session
 - Format distribution of the top 29 workshop proposals - 17 Panel, 2 roundtable, 4 open forum, 2 BoF, 1 Hackathon, 2 Workshop
 - Further analysis will be done on the distribution of topics and sub-themes.
 - Some sessions currently have less than one or no speakers confirmed yet

- A program committee call will be held next week to finalize the selected workshop list

Discussions

- Program Committee raised 2 questions:
 - Shall more than 1 workshop proposal from the same organizer be accepted for those scored high?
 - Shall the selection favor proposals with more confirmed speakers or allow workshop organizer to confirm and update their speakers before we finalize the list?
- Wilson suggested that we allow up to 2 workshop proposals to be accepted from the same organizer. He further declared his conflict of interest that APNIC submitted two workshop proposals that are on the accepted list.
- Xue agreed that proposals with more confirmed speakers shall be favored
- Singh echoed his agreement to Wilson and Xue on both questions. Hilyard, Okutani and Hotta also showed their support. Okutani added that the global IGF limitation is 3 proposals per organizers to be accepted and therefore setting a limit of 2 for APriGF is reasonable.
- Okutani suggested to implement a merit point scheme for workshop organizers in future CFP on subsequent proposals submission.
- Soong proposed that we give a 1-week period for workshop organizers to update on their speakers confirmation status. Consensus reached among the MSG considering that some of the organizers might not have managed to confirm their speakers at the time of submission.
- Okutani enquired about the timeline of result announcement to workshop organizers and suggested to inform the organizer about the delay.
- Astbrink asked if workshop organizers cannot confirm speakers within the 1-week deadline, will their proposals be demerit. Wilson suggested that Program Committee to discuss and decide on this.
